Order on Agreed Motion to Set Aside Default Judgment

General Remarks and Official Action Taken:

The subject of this order is the request to set aside Commissioner's Order No. 2026-9952 filed by Texas Department of Insurance (TDI) Enforcement staff. This order sets aside Order No. 2026-9952 and reopens the matter for further proceedings.

Background

On June 2, 2026, Commissioner's Order No. 2026-9952 was issued, revoking any licenses held by Hugo Hernandez. The order was issued following the failure of Mr. Hernandez to respond to the notice of allegations sent to him by TDI Enforcement staff under 28 Tex. Admin. Code § 1.47.

On June 18, 2026, Enforcement staff submitted an agreed motion to set aside the default judgment. In the motion, Enforcement staff said that after Order No. 2026-9952 was issued, they were contacted by Mr. Hernandez saying he was waiting for further notice from TDI regarding the action when he received the default order. Enforcement staff agreed with Mr. Hernandez to request that Order No. 2026-9952 be set aside to allow further proceedings.

Discussion

Under 28 Tex. Admin. Code § 1.47(d)(2), a motion to set aside a default order and reopen the record will be granted if the requesting party establishes that the failure to

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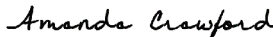
file a written response to a notice of allegations was neither intentional nor the result of conscious indifference, and that such failure was due to a mistake or accident.

Under Government Code § 2001.146, a motion for rehearing must be filed no later than the 25th day after the date the order is signed unless an extension is granted. The motion must identify with particularity findings of fact or conclusions of law that are the subject of the complaint and any evidentiary or legal ruling claimed to be erroneous. The motion must also state the legal and factual basis for the claimed error.

Because TDI Enforcement staff and Mr. Hernandez have agreed that Order No. 2026-9952 should be set aside to allow further proceedings and timely submitted a motion making that request, the motion should be granted.

Order

It is ordered that TDI Enforcement staff's agreed motion to set aside the default judgment is granted. Commissioner's Order No. 2026-9952 is set aside, and the record is reopened for further action by the parties.
