General remarks and official action taken:

This is a default order taken against Carlos Alvis Landaeta (Respondent) because evidence shows that he cheated on his licensing exam to obtain an insurance license. Respondent did not respond to a Notice of Allegations mailed by the Texas Department of Insurance. This order revokes Respondent's license.

The following findings of fact and conclusions of law are adopted:

Findings of Fact

Failure to Respond to Notice of Allegations

1. On April 7, 2026, the department sent a Notice of Allegations, attached as Exhibit A, to Respondent.
2. The department sent the Notice of Allegations to Respondent's last known address provided in writing to the department, [REDACTED], Converse, Texas 78109. The department also sent the Notice of Allegations to Respondent's electronic mail address he last designated for receipt of official department communications, [REDACTED].

3. The department gave Respondent notice and opportunity for a hearing, which Respondent waived by failing to send a written response to the Notice of Allegations within 20 days after the date it was mailed.
4. The department's factual allegations set out in the attached Notice of Allegations are incorporated in this order as findings of fact.

Conclusions of Law

1. The commissioner has jurisdiction under Texas law, including TEX. INS. CODE §§ 82.051-82.055, 4001.002, 4001.102, 4001.105, 4005.101-4005.105, and 4054.051, and TEX. GOV'T CODE §§ 2001.003(1) and 2001.051-2001.178.
2. The commissioner has authority to dispose of this case informally under TEX. GOV'T CODE § 2001.056, TEX. INS. CODE § 82.055, and 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 1.47.
3. The department provided proper notice to Respondent under TEX. GOV'T CODE §§ 2001.003(1), 2001.051, 2001.052, 2001.054, and 2001.056(4), and 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 1.1302, 1.28, 1.47, and 19.906.
4. Based on Respondent's failure to send the department a written response to the Notice of Allegations, the department is entitled to disposition by default under 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 1.47.
5. Respondent failed to show compliance with the law.
6. The department's factual and legal allegations set out in the attached Notice of Allegations are incorporated in this order and deemed admitted as true under 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 1.47.

Order

It is ordered that any licenses held by Carlos Alvis Landaeta are revoked. A copy of this order will be provided to law enforcement or other appropriate administrative agencies for further investigation as may be warranted.

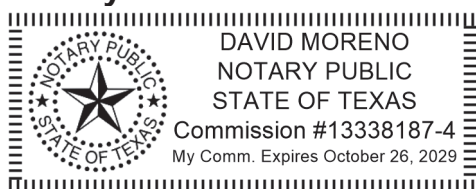

NOTICE OF ALLEGATIONS AGAINST CARLOS ALVIS LANDAETA

The Texas Department of Insurance (TDI) seeks to take disciplinary action against you. This Notice states the allegations against you and the relief sought by TDI.

YOUR WRITTEN RESPONSE IS REQUIRED WITHIN 20 DAYS

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO A HEARING AND ARE INVITED TO SHOW COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAW. To request a hearing, you must send a written response to TDI within 20 days of the date this Notice was mailed.

If you fail to send a written response by the deadline, *you waive your right to a hearing*, and TDI may seek disposition by default under 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 1.47, TEX. INS. CODE § 82.055, and TEX. GOV'T. CODE § 2001.056.

If you fail to send a written response by the deadline, without further notice to you, the commissioner of insurance may issue a default order that admits the factual matters asserted, deems all allegations as true, and orders the relief recommended in this Notice.

Jurisdiction

The commissioner of insurance has jurisdiction over this matter under TEX. INS. CODE §§ 82.051–82.055, 4001.002, 4005.101, 4005.102, and 4054.051, and TEX. GOV'T CODE §§ 2001.003(1) and 2001.051–2001.178.

Factual Allegations

Licensure

1. Carlos Alvis Landaeta (Alvis Landaeta), individual identification number 2891647, holds a Texas general lines life, accident, and health license, originally issued by TDI on February 14, 2024.

Examinations Background During Pandemic

2. TDI has contracted with Pearson Vue, a corporation specializing in the administration of licensing and credentialing examinations, to administer the department's written examinations for professional licensure in the business of insurance. Pearson Vue normally administers testing at in-person testing sites, which Pearson Vue maintains directly or contracts with third parties to use their testing sites for in-person examinations.
3. Pearson Vue provides all individuals who take a professional licensing examination with written procedures detailing the specific conduct that is prohibited during the examination.
4. For an examinee to take an exam administered by Pearson Vue, the examinee must agree to follow Pearson Vue's written procedures. If an examinee does not agree to follow Pearson Vue's written procedures, he or she is not permitted to take an examination.
5. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Pearson Vue initiated its OnVue Program (OnVue), which permitted examinees to take the written examination at a remote location of their choice, apart from an in-person testing center. Examinees were permitted to take exams through OnVue only in English.
6. Calendar year 2023 was the last full year Pearson Vue administered OnVue exams before terminating online testing in 2024.

7. In 2023, for exams where the examinee completed at least 75% of the questions on the English language exam at an in-person testing center, examinees completed the exams in, on average:
 - 100.2 minutes for the Texas General Lines Life, Accident, and Health Exam;
 - 99.2 minutes for the Texas General Lines Property and Casualty Exam;
 - 70.9 minutes for the Texas Life Agent Exam; and
 - 74.3 minutes for the Texas Personal Lines Property and Casualty Exam.
8. In 2023, for exams where the examinee completed at least 75% of the questions on the English language exam at an in-person testing center, only five percent of examinees completed the exam in, on average:
 - 53.6 minutes or less for the Texas General Lines Life, Accident, and Health Exam;
 - 54.9 minutes or less for the Texas General Lines Property and Casualty Exam;
 - 35.7 minutes or less for the Texas Life Agent Exam; and
 - 40.7 minutes or less for the Texas Personal Lines Property and Casualty Exam.

Examinees whose time falls in this category are considered empirically fast because 95% of examinees used more time to complete the same exams.

Exam Cheating

9. On February 9, 2024, Alvis Landaeta took the Texas General Lines Life, Accident, and Health Exam using OnVue. Alvis Landaeta completed the examination in 15 minutes and received a passing score.
10. Alvis Landaeta completed and passed the examination in 15 minutes using OnVue, despite the average time to complete the same examination at an in-person testing center being 100.2 minutes. Alvis Landaeta's time is considered empirically fast because 95% of examinees used more time to complete the same exam.
11. Alvis Landaeta was one of 119 examinees who took their tests on the same physical computer, identified as DESKTOP-FL9C4J1. The majority of these examinees also used the same external IP address, indicating they were taken on the same network or in the same general area.

12. TDI's investigation revealed that Alvis Landaeta more likely than not cheated on the licensing examination to obtain an insurance license.

Legal Allegations

1. Alvis Landaeta willfully violated an insurance law of this state, in violation of TEX. INS. CODE § 4005.101(b)(1).
2. Alvis Landaeta intentionally made a material misstatement in the license application, in violation of TEX. INS. CODE § 4005.101(b)(2).
3. Alvis Landaeta obtained a license by fraud or misrepresentation, in violation of TEX. INS. CODE § 4005.101(b)(3).
4. Alvis Landaeta engaged in fraudulent or dishonest acts or practices, in violation of TEX. INS. CODE § 4005.101(b)(5).

Relief Sought

TDI seeks the following relief:

1. revocation of your license; and
2. imposition of any other just and appropriate relief to which the department may be entitled to by law, including any combination of the above actions.

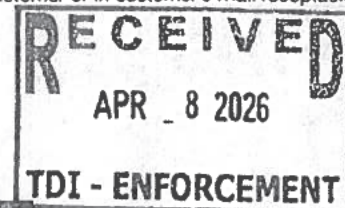
